- Image size should be between 1MB and 8MB. Images under 1MB may not be high enough quality for large scale printing. Images larger than 8MB may be rejected as too large by the email server

- Digital images should be submitted via email using the specified links available on the 2017 Japan Photo Contest webpage

For printed images:

- o Image Size No smaller than the dimensions of 8"x 10", but no larger than 24" x 36"
- Printed images must be delivered to the Consulate-General of Japan in Calgary [Suite 950 517, 10th Avenue, SW, Calgary, AB T2R 0A8] by the submission deadline, at the participant's expense.
- Send printed image on photographic paper only
- o Printed images must not be mounted or framed

 Fill out the pdf submission form provided on our website and either submit it by email to <u>submissions@cl.mofa.go.jp</u> or send along a printed form with your photo submission(s) by post.

If you are not chosen as a finalist, the following does not apply. However, if you are chosen as a finalist, you agree to grant the Consulate-General of Japan in Calgary a royalty-free, non-exclusive right, in perpetuity, to:

- Use the image & caption on the internet to promote Japan
- Provide the submitted image & caption to other organizations and individuals for noncommercial use, news stories, newsletters, reports, slide shows, displays, web pages, including Facebook pages
